
### Need a bit of help?...

You may be experiencing financial difficulties. You may have been made redundant, lost your source of income or just need a bit of additional support at this difficult time. Practical help is available. Fareshare have announced that thanks to donations of £10,000 from the Central England Co-op, £23,000 from The Vichai Fund and additional funding from Feeding Britain and Brakes Foundation, they will provide 66,000 meals to children and young people over the Summer Holidays.

Leicester City Adventure Playgrounds will be distributing free food available to anyone in need, regardless of whether they have previously used an adventure playground or not. The food will be in the form of 'Grab' Bags, daily either to consume on the premises or take away. In addition, food parcels - enough for 3 days provision - will be available weekly. Activity packs provided by the Arts Council will also be available.
