### Principal's Message

*We want our school to be a place where we are safe: to learn, have fun and work hard. A place where we are kind and mindful of everyone and have positive attitudes for our bright futures.*

Many thanks to the majority of parents who are helping to keep our school community safe when increasing numbers of schools are closing to groups of pupils. You can continue to help us stay safe by:

- Keeping socially distanced (2m) when in the queue and then as you walk through the one-way system
- Keep your children with you in the queue so that they are socially distanced and stay in their bubbles. Once collected, your children should stay with you as you walk through the school grounds
- Do not push into the queue – pushing in means social distancing cannot be maintained.
- Wear a face mask in the queue and around school.
- Do not bring additional adults with you and especially not other children who have been sent home from other schools to self-isolate

If you drive to school then please do not park on the zigzags or mount the kerb to park especially where the queue is. There is ample parking at the leisure centre so we can keep families safe.

A limited number of daily places will be available for a small charge – this will cover breakfast provision as well as supervision from 8am to 8.45am in the hall. Places will need to be booked and paid for in advance through Parent Pay so that we are able to make arrangements to support pupils in their Year group bubbles. We are currently working on plans to start an after school 'sporty social club' after half term – to be Covid secure this would be for each single year group bubble once a week (ie. Monday Y2, Tuesday Y3 etc) The club would run from 3.15pm-4.15pm and would offer table tennis, badminton as well as social activities. Places would be limited and initially offered to Years 2-6. ## Coats are essential!

We are aware that the current arrangements to keep the pupil bubbles and families safe and socially distanced mean that occasionally pupils will be waiting in the rain at the end of the day.



Unfortunately at this time we are unable to change this. With your help in moving through the school grounds quickly we are clearing the playground on average in 8 minutes. By sending your child with a warm/waterproof coat with a hood, we can help to make sure that they are kept as dry as possible whilst they wait to be collected.
