All pupils must wear correct uniform, including acceptable footwear, this includes grey not black trousers also leggings are not allowed in school. If you require academy uniform this can be ordered online or by visiting Uniform Direct in the city Centre.</p> 	<p>START OF DAY ACTIVITY (SODA)</p>  <p>For the first 15 minutes of every day there will be a focused Maths problems of the Day planned by the teacher. If your child arrives late they will miss this vital part of the school day. Therefore, it is important that your child arrives on time every day.</p>

<p>YEAR 6 CURRICULUM</p> <p>Over the Spring term, children will learn about two topics:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Right to Fight- the pupils will learn about the impact of World War 2 and understand the key events during this period of time. • Misty Mountains- the pupils will learn about the formation of mountains and examine mountain ranges in detail, including the Himalayan Mountains. <p>Please see the sheet attached to this newsletter for more information about these topics in Year 6 this term.</p> <div data-bbox="161 927 638 1117">  </div>	<p>PHYSICAL EDUCATION</p> <p>Our PE days this term are Wednesday and Friday. PE is part of our academy curriculum and we expect all children to come into school in the correct uniform for P.E.</p> <p>All jewellery must be removed. Earrings need to be removed on the day of PE or the child must be able to remove these themselves before the lesson. Teachers and Teaching Assistants are not allowed to help children remove their earrings. If your child has recently had their ears pierced they will have to bring micropore tape to cover their earrings until they can take them out.</p> <div data-bbox="833 826 1283 1059">  </div>	<p>HOMEWORK</p> <p>We expect children to be reading for at least 10 minutes daily. It would be really beneficial if you could listen to your child read and discuss their book regularly to support their understanding.</p> <p>Continued practise of times tables is also encouraged using our online platform Times Tables Rockstars</p> <p>In addition to this, Queensmead Quests will be released for during the term for pupils to complete, these will provide the children with a range of activities to support their learning in a variety of curriculum areas.</p> <p>SPELLINGS</p> <p>These will be practised and taught in the classroom daily. We are using an approach where we revisit, learn, practise and apply our spelling patterns on a daily basis. We will be learning spelling patterns and the statutory Year 6 Spellings.</p>
