We're delighted to share that our school has been taking part in The World Reimagined: a UK-wide art education project featuring globally-recognised artists to transform how we understand the Transatlantic Trade in Enslaved Africa and its impact on us all. This is not 'Black History', this is all of our history.

The World Reimagined will see a trail of large Globe sculptures across 7 UK cities from 13 August to 31 October 2022, created by artists to bring to life a powerful journey of discovery that explores our shared history and the future we can create together.

For the last few weeks - alongside 150+ schools across the country - we have been exploring our shared history and engaging with ideas around how we can make racial justice a reality in the future - and our students' power to create change.
