PE & Sport Premium Package 2022 – 2023

The package below details the support, resources and opportunities which GAT academies will be able to access as part of their ongoing commitment to and development of high-quality Physical Education, School Sport and Physical Activity (PESSPA). Academies will be asked to use £2,500 from their PE and Sport Premium Funding in order to facilitate the provision.

There is a significant focus within the package on supporting academies to deliver exciting, healthy, active opportunities that help to build the physical, social and emotional wellbeing of young people using the power of PESSPA as a vehicle to socialise and meet the individual needs of your children.

The package again supports the overarching objective of creating a sustainable model of outstanding delivery.

Professional learning support and resources for the development of high quality PE, School Sport & Physical Activity (PESSPA), delivered in partnership with Allison Consultancy:

1. Central Training

 3 x days of central training for all GAT PE Coordinators Key areas of focus are identified from within the group and themes that come from GAT academy assurances. They are likely to include:

- Developing high quality practice and provision in relation to your PE Curriculum Journey (Intent, Implementation and Impact)
- Resources to evidence the quality of PE Intent, implementation and Impact
- 30 minutes a day monitoring and developing your provision
- PE Deep Dive and information on Ofsted Inspection
- Updates and guidance on any changes to latest national and Trust requirements with regards to COVID-19
 PESSPA Safe-Practice. This includes information from DfE, Youth Sport Trust, the national Association for
 PE (afPE), GAT and Allison Consultancy
- The PE and Sport Premium website compliancy, Plans and the Conditions of the Grant funding
- PE and Sport Premium RAG Review and identification of key actions
- Ofsted and DfE requirements in relation to PE and School Sport Premium
- Sharing of best practice to support pupil well-being
- Resources and strategies to develop pedagogy within PE
- Safe-guarding / Health and Safety Updates

PE coordinators will access the training, enhance their own knowledge and understanding, cascade information back to colleagues at individual academies and work with colleagues to create opportunities for pupils.

This is also a networking opportunity for primary PE leads to create professional contacts, share practice, develop new opportunities and discuss challenges.





2. Bespoke Support

- 1 x 5 hour day of bespoke support per academy
- These can be facilitated 'remotely' or in-school

Allison Consultancy will liaise with you to identify your needs and bespoke the support accordingly. There is flexibility for the training to be delivered to whole school, PE Coordinator, Midday Supervisors or pupils

Popular choices include:

 Young Leader Training, PE Deep Dive, Move Off & Think (MOT), Active Playgrounds, Gymnastics, Dance and Games training are available, alongside areas such as Assessment in PE and how to plan and deliver outstanding PE

Of particular interest are the following two opportunities:

Super Me! 2 - Practical Activities to develop health and well-being for your children

This remains current with the focus on children's well-being after the pandemic. The day is delivered practically, in-school. It includes a mixture of the following to meet your needs:

- Up to 4 x modelled sessions with children and staff
- 1 x Staff twilight session and 1 x session with PE Lead
- Focus on developing the well-being of your children through simple, healthy, physical activity and relaxation strategies
- The session is a mixture of practical activities, core strength and stretching, and relaxation

Outcomes for staff:

- Greater understanding of simple, practical activities to support the development of children's well-being
- Supports PE Lead and the school with the achievement of PE & Sport Premium Outcome Indicator 2

Leading to the following impact / outcomes for children:

- Development of self-esteem
- A better understanding of their own emotions and behaviours
- Children know how to use simple movements to help them relax and focus their minds
- Helps children to find the superhero power inside themselves, to have the confidence and resilience to tackle different situations

Leaders will be provided with a report detailing areas of strength and areas of development at the beginning of the academic year The report should be used to inform the Principal's self evaluation of the Sport Premium Risk Indicator
• 1 x 5 hour day review	 Allison Consultancy in partnership with GAT will carry out a PE / sport review on site on each primary academy in the academic year 22/23 This is a supportive process to help academy leaders identify key strengths and key areas for improvement in their provision of curriculum PE, school sport and physical activity. It will also explore further the use and impact of the PE and Sport Premium with a focus on sustainability

Enables pupils to perform at a formal venue – one of our secondary academies. Spring term
Inter Academy Primary Athletics event	 The opportunity for pupils to compete in the equivalent to a national competition with over 600 participants. 20 Year 5/6 pupils per academy. Pupils enhance their understanding and life experiences by competing and socialising with children from a variety of diverse cultural backgrounds. Academies throughout the Trust join together to recognise and celebrate the significance of sport. Summer term at Braunstone Leisure Centre, Leicester.
Special Schools Sporting Calendar	 Competitions/festivals specifically designed to support the development of pupils with SEN.
