




YEAR 3 TERMLY NEWSLETTER: SUMMER TERM 2024

We are now into the first half term of Summer and it's great to see the children settled back into their class. They have quickly remembered all the routines of school life and are enjoying their learning. This term the children will be studying two topics: Under Our Feet and Colourful Cultures. They will take part in lots of exciting activities which cover all areas of the curriculum. We are especially looking forward to our Trip to Beacon Hill to visit an extinct volcano. Thank you for supporting your child at home with any homework, learning their times tables, spellings and reading. However, the expectation is that your child reads with you at least four times a week for five minutes or longer. We would like to share with you some information about what your child will be learning over the Summer Term, as well as offering you opportunities to support your child's understanding of subjects studied (see next page).

<p>HIGH EXPECTATIONS</p> <p>We expect a high standard of behaviour from all children which is monitored by all staff in the academy. The Behaviour Policy (which can be found on our website) explains the academy rules, rewards and sanctions in detail.</p> <p>Every week we have a celebration assembly where achievements are shared and certificates are awarded (including Star of the Week and House Points certificates).</p> <p>Unacceptable behaviour, both in and out of the classroom, will be dealt with firmly but fairly according to the academy's Behaviour Policy. You will be informed of any major incidences, or if your child's behaviour results in two or more detentions within a period of two weeks.</p>	<p>UNIFORM</p> <p>Uniform is the same for Years 1-3. All pupils must wear correct uniform, including acceptable footwear. A letter will be sent home with pupils who have missing or wearing incorrect uniform. Please refer to the Uniform Policy on our website for further information, including PE kit. If you require academy uniform this can be purchased from Uniform Direct in Leicester City Centre or online via our website.</p>  <p>TRIP DAY</p> <p>Our trip to Beacon Hill is planned for Thursday 9th May. The purpose of the day is to experience an extinct volcano, compare different rocks and see different rock formations and to compare the physical and human features with our locality. Please ensure that you have given your permission on ParentPay for this.</p>	<p>START OF DAY ACTIVITY (SODA)</p> <p>For the first 15 minutes of every day there will be a focused learning activity planned by the teacher. Throughout the Summer Term, we will be focusing on either practising times tables and related division facts or arithmetic skills.</p> <p>It is also a time to get help with any areas they are struggling with and ensure they are prepared for the day.</p> <p>If your child arrives late, they will miss this vital part of the school day. Therefore, it is important that your child arrives on time (by 8:50am) every day. Doors open at 8:45am for a prompt start at 8.50am. The gates then shut at 9am.</p>
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<p>YEAR 3 CURRICULUM</p> <p>Over the Summer term, children will learn about the rocks, location of volcanoes, similarities and differences in physical geography between Mount Vesuvius and Beacon Hill (extinct volcanoes)</p>  <p>In Summer 2, children will learn about Western Africa through our theme, 'Colourful Cultures'. During this theme, we will locate the continents of the world and locate the world's countries with a specific focus on Western African countries and European Countries.</p>  <p>Within this theme, we will be looking at African repeating patterns / animal prints and will have a go at different printing techniques. Please see the sheet attached to this newsletter for more information about these topics in Year 3 this term.</p>	<p>PHYSICAL EDUCATION</p> <p>Our PE day this term is on Tuesday. PE is part of our academy curriculum and we expect all children to wear a full PE kit to school so that they can take part in their PE sessions on this day</p> <p>Jewellery should not be worn on this day. Earrings cannot be worn during PE sessions. Teachers and Teaching Assistants are not allowed to help children remove their earrings. If your child has recently had their ears pierced they will have to bring micropore tape to cover their earrings until they can take them out.</p>	<p>HOMEWORK</p> <p>Queensmead Quests will continue to be given out once per half term. The aim is to provide a range of challenges for your child to choose from. We would be grateful if you can support and encourage them. If your child experiences any difficulties with the homework, we encourage them to come and see their class teacher for more support.</p> <p>In addition, we expect children to be reading for at least 10 minutes daily. It would be really beneficial if you could listen to your child read and discuss their book regularly to support their understanding.</p> <p>SPELLINGS & TIMESTABLES</p> <p>Children have logins to Purple Mash and Times Table Rock Stars / NumBots where they can access a range of activities and improve their times tables skills. Please encourage your child to play on Times Table Rock Stars and/or NumBots at least 3 times per week (for 5-10 minutes).</p> <p>They also have weekly spellings which they are welcome to practise at home as well as at school.</p>
